Voter registration

Do you have a current Washington driver’s license? Register to vote or update your current registration online! www.sos.wa.gov

Election Day	Standard deadline for internet and paper applications and updates	Late deadline ONLY in-person registration if not already registered in Washington
Tuesday	Monday	Monday
February 9	January 11	February 1
April 27	March 29	April 19
May 18	April 19	May 10
August 17	July 19	August 9
November 2	October 4	October 25

Standard deadline = Applications or updates must be postmarked or submitted no later than the Monday four weeks before Election Day.

Late deadline = If you are not currently registered in Washington, you can register at the County Auditor’s Office until the Monday one week before Election Day.

Applications and updates submitted after the deadline will take effect after the current election.

Voting by mail

Since November 2005, Yakima County has conducted all elections by vote-by-mail ballot.

In a vote-by-mail environment, all registered voters are mailed a ballot approximately 20 days prior to each election for which they are eligible to vote.

Replacement ballots

If you do not receive a ballot, or it is lost, spoiled or damaged, you may contact the election division for a replacement ballot.

Returning your ballot

First class postage is required if you return your voted ballot by mail and must be postmarked on or before Election Day. You may also bring your voted ballot to a Designated Accessibility Site.

Designated Accessibility Sites

Accessible Voting Units are available at these sites for individuals who are unable to vote by using their paper ballot. These units have the capability to read the ballot to you in English or Spanish. Tactile switches are also available for individuals with manual dexterity issues.

Voted paper ballots may also be returned at these sites.

Please NOTE: The following two locations are only available when elections are held in the surrounding area and are only open on election day.
