Describe Fiscal Impact:

Total allocation of ARPA funds for all projects that were applied for is \$30,348,008.50 and with \$10 million set aside for Broadband and \$9 million for Revenue Loss, the County has allocated \$49,348,008.50, which is \$618,869.50 more than was received in ARPA funds, but will be offset with interest earnings from the ARPA funds.

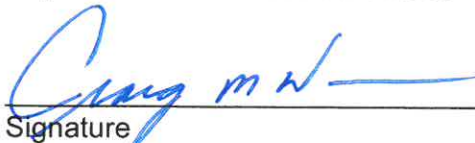

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN EXPENDITURE FROM THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN FUNDS TOWARDS 2022 YAKIMA COUNTY ARPA FUND APPLICATIONS

069 - 2023

WHEREAS, the United States Congress passed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, effective March 11, 2021 (“ARPA” or the “Act”); **and**,

WHEREAS, Yakima County was allocated ARPA funds totaling approximately \$48.8 million to aid in the COVID-19 pandemic response and economic recovery, of which \$24.4 million was received by the County in May of 2021 with the remainder received in May of 2022.; **and**,

WHEREAS, Yakima County Commissioners created the 2022 Yakima County ARPA Funds Application and received over 150 submitted applications; **and**,

WHEREAS, the number of applications received shows a great need in our community and the Yakima County Commissioners have worked diligently to try and maximize the ARPA funds to meet as many requests as possible; **and**,

WHEREAS, Unfortunately, due to the limited number of funds available some of the applications had to be denied and a letter was sent to each applicant with a list of additional funding opportunities; **and**,

WHEREAS, weighted emphasis for grant applications was placed on projects that had multiple funding sources, cash investments or in-kind investments, in addition to Yakima County’s requested investment, to maximize impact and efficiency; **and**,

WHEREAS, the Yakima County Board of Commissioners finalized their deliberations on February 27, 2023 and approved the funding of said applications entitled Exhibit A; **now, therefore**,

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Yakima County Commissioners that the 2022 ARPA Funds Applications entitled Exhibit A were approved for the awarded amount stated below.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Yakima County Commissioners that agreements are to be created with each of the entities being awarded ARPA funding that provides the specific requirements of these federal funds as outlined in the US Treasury guidelines.
