13. DISCUSSION

ALS Appeal of Protest Denial: Attorney James Carmody, representing Advanced Life Systems (ALS), explained the company's reasons for protesting the Board of County Commissioners' decision to accept the recommendation of McGrath Consulting Group to select and negotiate with American Medical Response (AMR) in the EMS Ambulance RFP process. Since the Prosecutor's Office subsequently denied Advanced Life Systems' protest, ALS has now opted to appeal this decision to the BOCC. He questioned why the Board and staff were never

provided with the scoring information and supporting documents they had requested, and noted that submitting a public records request for this information had not been successful, either. He argued that the RFP decision should have rested more fully with the Board, not a consulting firm, and debated various aspects of the scoring criteria and process. He also argued that AMR should have disclosed additional information that would have been relevant to the decision. Finally, he contended that Yakima would be better served by two ambulance companies than one. Jake Grant (General Manager of ALS) and Shawn Baird (Vice President of MetroWest Family of Companies, of which ALS is a member) further expounded on this point, sharing concerns about lack of competition with a single provider, and asserting that a better-regulated two-provider system could be implemented within 30 to 60 days. Mr. Carmody concluded by questioning AMR's track record in other communities.

Commissioner Curtis asked Mr. Carmody about the RFP language requesting proposals based on a one-provider system. Mr. Carmody explained that ALS has submitted one such proposal, but had also submitted a proposal for a two-provider system based on other RFP language stating that the Board still retained the authority to explore other options.

Commissioner Curtis also asked about staff's responses to his public records requests. Mr. Carmody stated that he had requested records such as scoring information and supporting documents from both Yakima County and the City of Yakima, and staff indicated that they would also like to see these records, but hadn't received them either. He added that he would like greater transparency from committees.

The Board proceeded to discuss how soon to deliberate and decide on this matter.
