**INTERGOVERNMENTAL LOCAL AGREEMENT EXTENSION
FOR STORMWATER PERMIT COMPLIANCE ACTIVITIES**
BETWEEN
YAKIMA COUNTY
AND
THE CITIES OF
YAKIMA, UNION GAP AND SUNNYSIDE

March, 2011

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into between Yakima County, a municipal corporation of the State of Washington, hereinafter referred to as "County", and the Cities of Yakima, Union Gap and Sunnyside, all being municipal corporations, hereinafter referred to as "Yakima", "Union Gap" and "Sunnyside" respectively, or "Cities" when it includes all, or "City" when it is either Yakima, Union Gap or Sunnyside; and,

WHEREAS, Yakima County and the Cities of Yakima, Union Gap and Sunnyside are required to comply with the State of Washington's Eastern Washington Phase II Municipal Stormwater General Permit, hereinafter referred to as "Permit"; and,

WHEREAS, the County and Cities formed the Regional Stormwater Policy Group to ascertain the most cost beneficial course of action for the Parties in order to provide the best value to their citizens concerning NPDES II stormwater plan development for respective Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems; and,

WHEREAS, the County and Cities acknowledge the financial and consistency benefits of a regional plan and agree to continue as primary and co-permittees to meet the Permit requirements of regulated small MS4s, as allowed under the Permit; and,

WHEREAS, the County and Cities have agreed that the County would administer and manage a Permit as the primary permittee with Cities as co-permittees for the respective Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems; and,

WHEREAS, the County and Cities under RCW Chapter 39.34, have the legal authority to enter into interlocal agreements for the sewerage and stormwater management programs within its boundaries consistent with relevant laws; and,

WHEREAS, the County and Cities have authority to operate and maintain storm and surface water management systems and many other services as provided for under their relevant laws; and,

WHEREAS, the County and Cities have enjoyed a strong and effective partnership under an existing interlocal agreement for permit years four and five effective November 10, 2009; and,

WHEREAS, the existing interlocal agreement specifies timelines for a future interlocal agreement to share permit compliance tasks in a future permit to be issued by Washington State Department of Ecology, and,

WHEREAS, the Washington State Department of Ecology is approximately six months behind schedule developing the next permit that will specify compliance tasks to be shared by the County and Cities; and,

WHEREAS, the County and the Cities would like to continue the regional stormwater approach for public benefit; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and agreements to be kept and performed by the parties hereto, it is agreed as follows:

Section 1. Modification of previous ILA

The ILA titled "*Intergovernmental Local Agreement For Stormwater Permit Compliance Activities Between Yakima County And The Cities Of Yakima, Union Gap And Sunnyside, September, 2009*" (2009 ILA) is modified as follows:

Section 12. Duration

This Agreement is for Years four (4) and five (5) of the Permit effective February 16, 2007 (current Permit) and will be reviewed by all Parties upon receipt of a Public Review and Comment Draft of the Municipal Stormwater General Permit issued by Ecology for discharges on or after February 16, 2012 (next Permit) for consideration of continuing the Agreement beyond the current permit cycle, and for potential amendment of responsibilities.

A decision and written commitment to amend and/or extend the Agreement for the next Permit is required from all Parties within 60 days of receipt of a Public Review and Comment Draft of the next Permit or the Agreement terminates upon issuance of the next Permit.

Section 2. Retention of previous ILA sections

A. All other sections of the 2009 ILA remain valid and binding.

Section 3. Effective Date / Counterparts

This Agreement may be signed in counterparts, with each Party hereto receiving copies of all participating Party's fully executed signature pages. This Agreement shall become effective when executed by all Parties hereto.

ORDINANCE # 713

AN ORDINANCE of the City of Moxee, Washington annexing contiguous property into the corporate City limits of Moxee.

WHEREAS, The City Council of the City of Moxee, Washington has filed a Notice of Intention to annex certain real property with Yakima County Boundary Review Board File Number BRB 2012-001 and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 36.93.090 and RCW 36.93.100 the Yakima County Boundary Review Board did not invoke jurisdiction within the 45 day filing period and thereby deemed the annexation approved.

NOW THEREFORE THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOXEE, WASHINGTON DO ORDAIN as follows:

SECTION I ANNEXATION LEGAL DESCRIPTION

That portion of the East half of Section 36, Township 13 North, Range 19 East, W.M. and the west half of Section 31, Township 13 North Range 20 East, W.M. described as follows:

Beginning at the Southwest corner of the Northeast quarter of the Southeast quarter of said Section 36;
Thence Easterly along the South line of said Northeast quarter of the Southeast quarter to the northeast corner of the West half of the West half of the Southeast quarter of said Southeast quarter of Section 36;
Thence Southerly along the East line of said West half to the Southerly right of way line of Drainage District 11, Branch "D" Drain;
Thence Northeasterly along said Southerly right of way line to the Easterly line of Tract 4 of that Short Plat recorded in Volume "B" of Short Plats, Page 20, records of Yakima County, Washington;
Thence Southerly along said Easterly line to the Northerly right of way line of Postma Road;
Thence Easterly along said Northerly right of way line to the Easterly right of way line of Duffield Rd;
Thence Northerly along said Easterly right of way to the Northerly right of way line of Duffield Road;
Thence Westerly along said Northerly right of way line to the Northerly extension of the West line of the Northeast Quarter of the Southeast quarter of Said Section 36;
Thence Southerly along said line to the Point of Beginning.

Situate in Yakima County, State of Washington.

SECTION II TITLE

This Annexation shall be known as the Duffield Road Annexation.

SECTION III ANNEXATION EFFECTIVE DATE

The above described real property shall be hereby annexed into the corporate City limits of Moxee, Washington effective May 4th, 2012.

SECTION IV ORDINANCE FILING REQUIREMENTS

Annexation Ordinance and supporting documents shall be sent to State Office of Financial Management within thirty (30) days. The original ordinance copies shall be filed with the Yakima County Boundary Review Board for their distribution and filing. One (1) copy shall be sent to the Department of Revenue, Local Sales Tax Section.

SECTION V EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 36.93.090 and RCW 36.93.100 the Yakima County Boundary Review Board did not invoke jurisdiction within the 45 day filing period and thereby deemed the annexation approved.

NOW THEREFORE THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOXEE, WASHINGTON DO ORDAIN as follows:

SECTION I ANNEXATION LEGAL DESCRIPTION

That portion of the South half of Section 26, the Southeast quarter of Section 27, the Northeast quarter of Section 34 and North half of Section 35, Township 13 North, Range 19 East, W.M., described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the Southerly right of way line of Mieras Road and the Westerly right of way line of Ekelman Road;
Thence Westerly along said Southerly right of way line of Mieras Road to the East line of the West half of the Northwest quarter of said Section 35;
Thence South along said East line of said West half to the South line of said Northwest quarter;
Thence West along said South line of said Northwest quarter to the Northeasterly right of way line of State Route 24;
Thence Northerly along said right of way line to the Westerly right of way line of Birchfield Road;
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Thence Easterly along said extension and said Northerly right of way line to the Northerly extension of the Westerly right of way line of Ekelman Road;
Thence Southerly along said extension to the Point of Beginning.

Situate in Yakima County, State of Washington.

SECTION II TITLE

This Annexation shall be known as the BT Loftus Annexation.

SECTION III ANNEXATION EFFECTIVE DATE

The above described real property shall be hereby annexed into the corporate City limits of Moxee, Washington effective June 22nd, 2012.

SECTION IV ORDINANCE FILING REQUIREMENTS

Annexation Ordinance and supporting documents shall be sent to State Office of Financial Management within thirty (30) days. The original ordinance copies shall be filed with the Yakima County Boundary Review Board for their distribution and filing. One (1) copy shall be sent to the Department of Revenue, Local Sales Tax Section.

SECTION V EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE

This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after adoption and publication as required by law.





Summary of 2012 General Stormwater Permit public outreach activities

During calendar year 2012, Yakima County's MS4 General Stormwater Permit Public Education and Outreach Program conducted the following activities:

1. Regional Stormwater Management Group

The co-permittees met on several occasions to discuss outreach priorities and target audiences.

2. Post-campaign phone survey

In January the regional group's consultant conducted a post-outreach campaign survey of residents' stormwater awareness. After a short outreach effort in 2011, results showed slight improvement in public understanding of stormwater issues, but improvements were within the margin of error for the survey, so no conclusions can be drawn. Annual surveys are planned to measure how well the co-permittee outreach effort is doing.

3. General outreach campaigns

a. Billboard ads

The Regional Stormwater Management Group cost-shared a billboard ad campaign that placed an "Only Rain in the Drain" message on nine billboards across the county. Ads ran four weeks at the beginning of summer and another four weeks at the end of summer. Billboards ran longer than contracted for additional outreach.

b. Bus ads

The regional group cost-shared about \$3800 to finance advertising on six public transit buses for eight weeks.

c. Posters

The group produced an 11x17" *Only Rain in the Drain!* poster in English, Spanish and English-Spanish. Copies were distributed to the regional co-permittees for display in public places.

d. Printed materials

The regional group produced and distributed 2200 copies of the *Five Myths about Stormwater in Yakima County* brochure. It is available in English and Spanish at the main

desk at all municipal buildings, two libraries, the Health District, Ecology's Yakima office, WDFW and WSDOT. It is also available at the City of Yakima's Planning Department and Yakima County Public Services.

It also produced a 2013 calendar featuring *Only Rain in the Drain! An Informational Guide for Businesses and Residences on How to Manage Their Stormwater*. The calendars were distributed at the Central Washington State Fair.

e. Reception area video

The County developed a three and a half minute PowerPoint presentation designed to run continuously on the TV in the Yakima County Public Services reception area. The video was distributed to the regional co-permittees and to Y-PAC for air time.

f. Speakers bureau

In June, the County stormwater outreach coordinator contacted the Yakima Rotary, Yakima Chamber of Commerce, Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, American Legion Club, Yakima Valley Audubon Society, Associated General Contractors of WA, Horticulture Council, Yakima Education Association, Boy Scouts of America, Central WA Home Builders Association and Master Gardeners to determine their interest in a presentation about the regional stormwater management program. None indicated interest. Follow-up offers did not result in any interest as well.

g. Event participation

The group staffed a booth at the Central Washington State Fair in September and distributed almost all "Rain-in-the-drain" logo give-away items ordered: 500 each of pens, pencils, rulers, tote bags, crayons, water bottles, Frisbees, coffee mugs, calendars, coloring books and activity books were distributed, primarily to school-age children.

h. Y-PAC videos

The public access television station owned by City of Yakima aired a variety of stormwater message videos and the PowerPoint presentation (item 3.e., above) throughout the year.

i. Miscellaneous press coverage

The local paper covered the debate over financing Sunnyside's stormwater program, as well as local reaction to Ecology's new stormwater regulations.

4. Targeted campaigns

a. Businesses

The regional group produced *Only Rain in the Drain, an Informational Guide for Businesses on How to Manage Their Stormwater* as well as *Only Rain in the Drain, an Informational Guide for Contractors About Stormwater*. They were subsequently mass-mailed to

businesses and contractors in the permit area, along with a cover letter that described the consequences of stormwater permit violations.

The regional group also managed a campaign targeting carpet cleaning companies. It customized Ecology's *Good Business Practices for Carpet Cleaning & Wastewater Disposal* brochure with local contact information, then mailed it out with a cover letter that described the consequences of stormwater permit violations.

5. Special projects

a. J Street Low Impact Development Demonstration Project

The Yakima newspaper featured a story in April 2012 describing West Valley High School's participation in a simulated storm event, analyzing the volume and quality of runoff from three types of road pavement. It followed up with a story describing sampling results.

b. Bio-retention LID demonstration project at the Yakima Area Arboretum

In May 2012 Yakima County Public Services Solid Waste Division and the Yakima Area Arboretum entered into a five-year Memorandum of understanding that describes each party's responsibilities in managing the xeric garden and green-built greenhouse at the Arboretum. Furthering the County/Arboretum relationship, the County Water Resources Division initiated a conversation with the Arboretum about developing a bio-infiltration demonstration project onsite.

c. Washington State University - Pullman Engineering School dog waste digester project design

Yakima County Water Resources Division met with a civil engineering student design team to develop a dog waste digester facility/dog park project to be located at the Yakima Area Arboretum, adjacent to the Humane Society. The student project will result in grant-ready designs.




