COMES NOW Drainage Improvement District No. 7 ("DID") through its undersigned supervisors and, pursuant to RCW 85.08.830, et. seq., petitions the Yakima County Board of County Commissioners ("Commissioners") to supervise and conduct proceedings to merge DID into Sunnyside Valley Irrigation District ("SVID"). In support of the Petition, DID states:

1. DID is a drainage improvement district organized and operated pursuant to RCW Chap. 85.08.

2. SVID is an irrigation district organized and operated pursuant to RCW Chap. 87.03.

3. DID is located entirely in Yakima County and within the boundaries of SVID.

4. DID's supervisors have, pursuant to SVID Resolution 1990-11-1, requested SVID consent to a merger between SVID and DID. A copy of DID's request is attached and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A".

WHEREFORE, DID requests the Yakima County Board of County Commissioners:


1. Order an election on the requested merger be held to approve or disapprove the merger.

2. Fix the time for the merger election and cause notice of the election to be published pursuant to RCW 85.08.870 and RCW 85.38.070.


3. Upon approval of the merger at the above-described election, the Yakima County Board of County Commissioners enter an Order approving the Petition, ordering the merger of DID and SVID, directing a certified copy of the Order be filed with the Yakima County Auditor, and directing the Yakima County Treasurer to deliver all DID funds to SVID's Treasurer.

THE ILLUSTRATION ABOVE SHOWS HOW THE TALLIES SHOULD BE MADE

The tallies must be made with indelible pencil or pen and ink as the name of each candidate written in is read aloud. Tallies should be made by marking a short mark across the face of the tally numbers (beginning with No. 1) at an angle (as shown above). When tallying on the second row of printed figures tally marks should be made at the reverse angle (as shown above). The same method of marking over numbers is followed in each line used. Immediately upon the completion of the tally, the clerk who completes it must draw two heavy lines in ink or indelible pencil from the last tally mark to the end of the line in which the tallies end, and also write the initials of the person marking the last tally in that line. (See above illustration.)

When the total vote has been tallied the total for each candidate must be written out in the left hand box preceding the word "votes" and set out in numerals in the right hand box. Directly above the total written in the left hand box write or print the name of the candidate clearly and under the total vote line write the name of the office (see above).




