Community-based Organizations Offering Free Rapid COVID-19 At-Home Tests to the Community

Yakima, WA- On December 7, the Yakima Health District (YHD) announced a program that Yakima County was selected to participate in called *Say Yes! COVID Test At-Home* Testing program. As expected, these rapid test kits are on track to run out this week. Individuals who have not placed an order yet can place their order online for free home delivery. The order link is also accessible on the Yakima Health District website.

Additionally, YHD has partnered with community-based organizations throughout Yakima County to give families free rapid at-home COVID-19 tests directly. If individuals are unable to place their order online or do not have access to the internet, YHD encourages them to visit any of these locations.
