Importance of COVID-19 Testing and Upcoming Closures at the Yakima State Fair Park and Sunnyside Community Center COVID-19 Testing Sites

Yakima, WA- COVID-19 testing is one of the many public health recommendations that is crucial in helping minimize the spread of COVID-19. Testing allows people to take precautions, like isolating, in a timely manner to prevent the virus from spreading. People who test positive for COVID-19 and are asymptomatic can still spread the virus, which is why isolation is so important.

Yakima County has three community-based testing sites that are available to the community, at no cost.

The Yakima Health District (YHD) encourages community members who have been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-19 or experience [symptoms of COVID-19](#) to get tested. For additional locations throughout the county, individuals can visit www.YakimaTesting.org or call 2-1-1 for more information. As a reminder, COVID-19 testing should not be sought at hospitals.

Upcoming Testing Site Closures

The Yakima State Fair Park testing site and Sunnyside Community Center testing site will be closed on Sunday, January 16th and will resume regular hours of operation on Monday, January 17th, Martin Luther King Jr day. YHD encourages individuals to plan ahead given the testing site closures. The Yakima Valley College testing site is expected to have regular hours of operation.
