

Examples of social media posts:	Create social media graphics and messaging around safe storage and reducing youth access. Example 1). How can I keep my kids safe from my personal vape/cannabis products?

Keep cannabis and vape products in a secure locked place. Cannabis and vape should be out of sight and out of reach of children, pets and adolescents to reduce accidental and intentional access.



Example 2). Responsible Cannabis and Vape

- Store safely in a lock box, bag or cabinet.
- Talk to your youth about responsible adult cannabis use and dangers of underage use.
- Inventory all cannabis and vape products and keep in their original packaging.
- Properly dispose of all cannabis and vape waste.

Example 4). The risks of cannabis and vape products to teens.

The brain isn't fully developed until the mid-20's. Any substance use including cannabis and vape before then harm parts of the brain that control attention, mood, learning and impulse control. Even occasional use can cause teens to engage in risky behavior, be taken advantage of or find them in vulnerable situations. [#knowtherisks](#)
