<b>OLD BUSINESS</b>	<p>Approval of Minutes: February 26, 2024, BH SUD Coalition Meeting.</p> <p><b><i>Megan Tweedy moved to approve the minutes from the February 26, 2024, BH SUD Coalition Meeting. Megan Takamori seconded. No one abstained/denied. The motion carried.</i></b></p>
<b>NEW BUSINESS</b>	<p>Priority Setting Group Activity/ Top Three Priorities Discussion</p> <p>BHSUDC members did an exercise to determine priorities for changes to the local behavioral health/substance use disorder response and treatment system. Prompt: If you had a magic wand and could change one thing, what would it be?</p> <p>Three systems priorities were identified by the group:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Increase in supportive housing availability with wrap-around services, including BH/SUD, medical, and dental</li><li>2. Medical detox</li><li>3. 24/7 warm handoffs between providers, LE, and other partners engaging with people in crisis</li></ol> <p>WA State Opioid Dashboard</p> <p>Melissa gave an update that Washington State is continuing to develop a data dashboard. Yakima County will be participating in a trial of the site as it is</p>

Update	developed. Melissa will send out additional information as it becomes available.
Jail Overdose Prevention	<p>Director Welch from the Yakima County Department of Corrections and Commissioner Linde presented a project regarding wristbands intended to monitor vitals of recently booked inmates who enter into jail while experiencing SUD. Director Welch explained that the first five days or so of incarceration are often highly dangerous for individuals in active addiction, and there have been several recent deaths in the jail due to overdose.</p> <p>As a precautionary measure, the Jail is exploring implementing a wristband system that monitors vitals for those most at risk. The cost of implementation would be \$90,000 for the cost to purchase 25 wristbands, plus \$50,000 per year for the cost to operate the program. Commissioner Linde added that while this is a new expense, recent lawsuits in other jails have established a legal precedent for in-jail overdose deaths leading to seven-figure lawsuits – which would be a much larger cost.</p> <p>The Board of County Commissioners are going to consider funding these monitoring wristbands out of the Opiate Settlement Funds. This is a project which would receive priority consideration due to both the responsibility and liability the County holds when it comes to inmate safety. There is no decision happening today – this agenda item is just for transparency to ensure that the BHSUDC members know that the project has emerged and has been part of BOCC discussions.</p> <p><b>Action Item: Director Welch will send Melissa a link to the wristbands so that she can share the information with BHSUDC members who are interested in learning more.</b></p> <p><b>This is the link: <a href="https://4sightlabs.com">Custody Protect   Monitor Detainees' Wellness Real-time (4sightlabs.com)</a></b></p>
