YAKIMA – The Homeless Housing and Assistance Program (HHAP) funds, which comprise both Local 2163 revenues and State Consolidated Homeless Grant (CHG) dollars, have been awarded for the upcoming grant cycle (starting July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2026).

“The County continues to work closely with community providers and partners to provide comprehensive support and services to those experiencing homelessness.” Stated Commissioner Curtis. *“These awards reflect the needs and our strategy to address homelessness in our community. We must ensure that our community's response is a multiprong approach for a multifaceted issue. One size doesn't fit all.”*
