The Yakima County Veterans Program provides temporary emergent relief and case management to low income Veterans and information and referral for federal, state, and local services to all Veterans and their family.

The Veterans Program is under the Yakima County Department of Financial Services.

The Yakima County Veterans Advisory Board advises the County Commissioners on policy and procedures. It is comprised of eleven county Veterans. The program is mandated by RCW 73.08.010, and receives no federal or state funding. The Program provides additional services through donations from individuals, businesses, and other organizations.

The Veterans Coordinator manages the program and services, and volunteer staff provide additional support.

We work collaboratively with our many partners and community groups to better serve our Veterans.

VETERANS RELIEF FUND

The Relief Fund assists qualified indigent Veterans with temporary emergency needs such as food, utilities, transportation, rent and burial. To qualify for this assistance, the Veteran, or family member, must meet the guidelines provided by Washington State RCW 73.08 and Yakima County Policy. Proof of services, residency, and indigent status must be verified. This is not an entitlement program. The appointment line is 509-574-1537.

INCARCERATED PROGRAM -

The Veterans Incarcerated Program assists incarcerated Veterans with non-violent offenses. The goal is to reduce recidivism and facilitate successful reintegration back into the community. Services that may be provided include: case management, addressing essential needs, medical issues, mental health and substance abuse counseling, transitional housing, finances, Veterans benefits, and other issues related to successful re-entry into our community.
